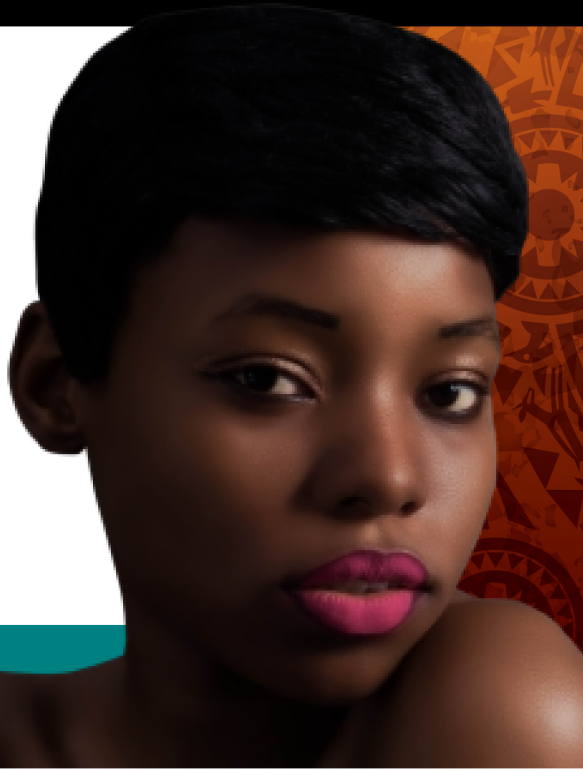
## ENDING SEXUAL ASSAULT

April is National Sexual Assault Awareness and Prevention Month. The work to prevent and end sexual violence has been ongoing for decades as advocates call attention to the building blocks of society that enable and even encourage violence.

**According to the Time's Up Foundation, as many as six in 10 Black women reported being subjected to coercive sexual contact by the age of 18.** Black women also report experiencing sexual harassment in their workplace at three times the rate of white women.

Black men, too, experience sexual assault. Data from the last two decades estimates that around **14% of all boys and men experience sexual assault**, though data about the rate at which Black boys and men are victims of sexual violence is often under reported.

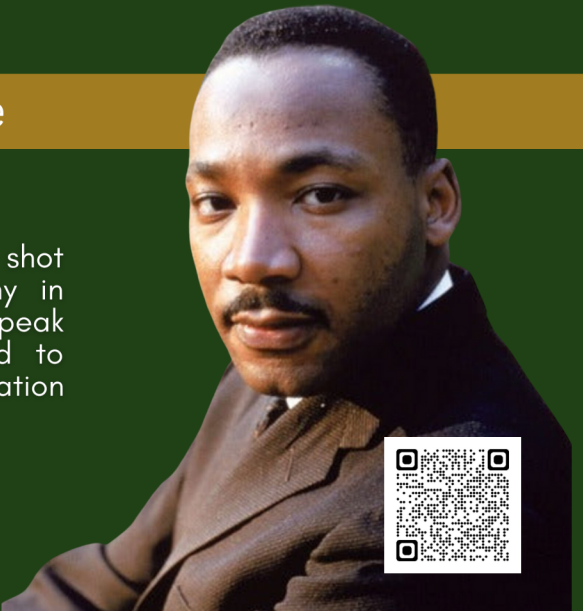


## eji A History of Racial Injustice

**this is a Season of replacing or repair of the worn out, run-down, or broken.**

Lent consists of the forty days before Easter in which Christians prepare to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ by practicing the spiritual disciplines of fasting, prayer, and penitence. Sundays are always excluded as fast days during Lent because they are mini-Easters that symbolize the weekly celebration of Jesus' resurrection.

MEATLESS MONDAYS | Abstain from all meat.

TEN DOLLAR TUESDAY | Spend \$10 or less for the entire day.

WATER ONLY WEDNESDAYS | Abstain from all other beverages.

THRICE THURSDAYS | Pray a minimum of three times..

FRIED-NOT-FRIDAYS | Abstain from all fried foods

SILENT SATURDAYS | At least one hour in silent meditation.

**#PALMSUNDAY2023** | The biblical foundations for the celebration of Palm Sunday are found in all four Gospels: Matthew 21:1-9, Mark 11:1-10, Luke 19:11-27, and John 12:12-19.

The synoptic accounts describe Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem riding on an ass or colt as large crowds waved branches and chanted "Hosanna to the one who comes in the Name of the Lord!"

We can accompany Jesus through the peaks of joy that include that first Palm Sunday and Holy Thursday, and also the valley of suffering and death on Friday because we are certain that communion with God and the family of God for all eternity will be the final word!

The Altar Candles acknowledge Sexual Assault Awareness Month. The history of Black women spearheading the fight against sexual assault is an important reminder not only of who started and leads this movement but also of how whitewashed content related to the movement continues to be. A powerful example of this is the case of Recy Taylor, an African American woman who, despite being blackmailed, refused to stay silent, and spoke out in 1944 against the white mob who had gang-raped her. Today, Black women continue to lead the movement to spread awareness about sexual assault and make positive changes.
