Women, making up 70 to 90 percent of black congregations, gathered to worship communally a God who gave freedom and liberation in the salvific power of Jesus of Nazareth. Mother Hill was selected as Church Mother by Pastor Johnson following the death of Mother Jewel Tremble in 2016 and supports the ministry as a chief advisor on all matters relating to the health and wellness of the Sweet Magnolia!





FASTING FOR LENT



February 22 - April 8

re·new·al

this is a Season of replacing or repair of the worn out, run-down, or broken.

Lent consists of the forty days before Easter in which Christians prepare to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ by practicing the spiritual disciplines of fasting, prayer, and penitence. Sundays are always excluded as fast days during Lent because they are mini-Easters that symbolize the weekly celebration of Jesus' resurrection.

MEATLESS MONDAYS | Abstain from all meat.

TEN DOLLAR TUESDAY | Spend \$10 or less for the entire day.

WATER ONLY WEDNESDAYS | Abstain from all other beverages.

THRICE THURSDAYS | Pray a minimum of three times..

FRIED-NOT-FRIDAYS | Abstain from all fried foods

SILENT SATURDAYS | At least one hour in silent mediation.

Responsive Reading In Praise of brilliant, beautiful and brave Black Women

LEADER: In memory of Isabella Baumfree who was transformed into Sojourner Truth because the Lord called her to travel up and down the land being a sign and to declare truth to her people. She responded to the man who charged that he cared no more for her than a fleabite, "Maybe not, but the Lord willing, I'll keep you scratching."

PEOPLE: Let the brilliant, beautiful, and brave Black women keep coming as we scratch out justice in the land.

LEADER: By the witness of Harriet Tubman, who in spite of a \$40,000 price on her life, challenged her people to "be free or die", and who courageously led them to freedom. She never lost a passenger as she showed her people a better way.

PEOPLE: Let the brilliant, beautiful, and brave Black women keep coming as conductors to keep a people on track to freedom.

LEADER: By the inspiration of Ida B. Wells and the First National Confederacy of Colored Women; Mary Margaret Washington and the National Federation of Afro-American Women; Mary Church Terrell and the National League of Colored Women; Rosa Parks whose tired feet inspired a nation to stand up; and Fannie Lou Hamer who left her cotton sack behind her and founded the Mississippi Freedom Democratic Party from whence she took her seat at the 1964 Democratic Convention. These countless women worked hard to inspire, encourage, and register voters so that we could move forward.

PEOPLE: Let the brilliant, beautiful, and brave Black women keep coming as we hammer out political opportunities for women who will change the course of history.

LEADER: We recognize women like Julia Kidd Stout who became the first African American woman elected to the bench in Philadelphia, Constance Baker Motley who was the first Black woman federal judge, and numerous other women of the Judiciary, including Leah Ward Sears, the first African American woman elected to a State Supreme Court and the first African American woman to serve as a Chief Justice of any State Supreme Court.

TOGETHER: Let brilliant, beautiful, and brave Black women keep coming as we render decisions that are equitable, compassionate, and morally sound. Let strong Black women keep coming until we have transformed America and made of this world a brotherhood and sisterhood where there is room for all and we "turn to each other and not on each other".

Book Recommendation

In My Grandmother's House, Yolanda Pierce, dean of Howard Divinity, builds an everyday womanist theology rooted in liberating scriptures, experiences in the Black church, and truths from Black women's lives. Pierce centers Black Women's experiences while teasing out the tensions of race, spirituality, trauma, freedom, resistance, and memory.
